Camp qualifications and requirements:

- Young people between the ages of 10 and 18
- Must be interested in creating and participating in a theatrical production
- Willing to commit to the entire two weeks
- Parents must pick up their children by 4 p.m. sharp — **NO EXCEPTIONS**
- Participants must bring their own lunches.

The Colonial Kids Summer Theater Camp is open to twenty-five young people, grades 5 through 12 who live in the 62nd Assembly District. Camp participants will be selected through a lottery process. During the two week camp, participants will learn about the historic Conference House and view demonstrations of colonial life. Participants, with the guidance of the teaching artist, will write a short play about the events at the Conference House based on the knowledge gained at camp. The final day of camp will culminate in a performance that takes the audience through important moments in colonial history, as participants re-create famous events and portray historical figures.
